

Commissioner Quick motioned to approve for 6 months pilot program for Infant at Work Policy and Guidelines, Commissioner Roe seconded. Motion passed.



Rick Wesley came in about burn ban.


Commissioner Mills motioned to have a burn ban starting today until March 30, 2026, Commissioner Roe seconded. Motion passed.


